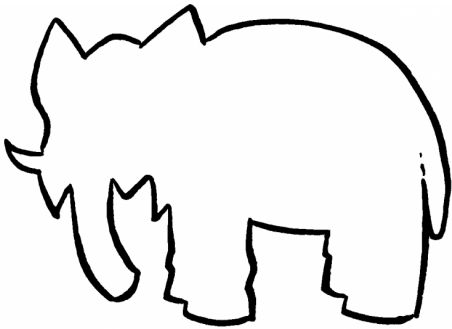


Input: Elephant
