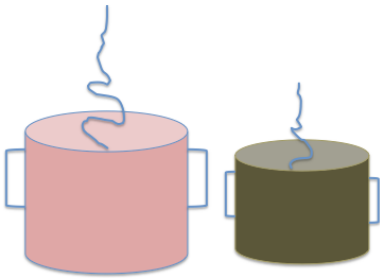


## Working in four workshops



Teenagers can work in an interest group of their choice for a certain period of time. They actively participate and suggest project topics themselves, e.g. foreign cooking

### The topics suggested here are:

- "Foreign Cooking"
- "Using the computer to create a newspaper"
- "Making games out of wood"
- "Making a short video"

#### Duration / period / effort:

The time frame depends on the projects. In this case it is about 6 x 3 hours and one common part per occasion for devotions. (E.g. learning about different biblical characters. It should be men and women so that both genders can identify with characters)

#### Suitable for:

Max 8 per group

#### Materials needed:

- Foreign cooking:
- Large kitchen, recipes, decorating materials (other groups will be invited on a rotating basis)

Newspaper with computer:

- Computer with user-friendly program
- Photographic camera
- Unique concept of a newspaper
- Time for overtime (possibly with teens)

Games made of wood:

- Workshop
- Experience with woodworking machines
- Examples or plans, books with games

Making a video:

- Video camera
- Video equipment and TV
- Good story, short mystery, solve-it-yourself mystery

### **Auxiliaries:**

Books by Wolfgang Ecke (short detective stories to solve yourself)

### **Cost:**

- Wood for games
- Food
- Video cassette

### **Important notes:**

Workshops are a hit for teens because for once they get to do what they choose and like to do themselves.
